1. General overview of recent major developments at the reporting library.

The Library is both the National Library and the library for the University of Iceland. The aim is to be a source of knowledge for everyone. It serves the Icelandic community in all areas of reference and academic discipline and plays a leading role in the collection, preservation and dissemination of information, thus making a vigorous contribution to culture, research and creative work. In accordance with performance target agreement between NULI and the Ministry of Education, Science and Culture, the Library's position as a knowledge provider has been underlined. With reference to the dual functions, emphasis has been placed mainly on *a digital national library* and *a digital research library*. The Library was established in 1994 with the union of the National Library of Iceland (founded in 1818) and of the library of the University of Iceland (founded 1940).

2. Note of the reporting library's relationship to government, citation of legislation which sets out the library's mandate, and legislation which affects the library's operations.

Early in 2013 the NULI started work on a new policy. The purpose was to develop guidelines for the employees of the Library while focusing on the Library's activities for the years to come. In forming the policy, there was extensive consultation with employees, partners, stakeholders and university students. The policy is based on services, electronic solutions, collection and organization of electronic material, as well as cooperation. More emphasis will be placed on research, innovation and changes in the use of the Library's premises. The new policy was published as: *Knowledge Source for Everyone: Policy of the National and University Library of Iceland for 2013 – 2017*. The Ministry of Education published a *Cultural Policy for Iceland* in 2013, based on a Parliamentary resolution on cultural policy. It was used as a background material in forming the Library's policy. Another document used, was *Governmental policy on the Information Society*, also from 2013.

4. New developments in creating and building collections.

Digitization

The total number of digitized pages of journals and newspapers available on *timarit.is* at the end of the year was 4.5 million. All the pages have been OCR-read. Digitization and cataloguing of manuscripts continued on *handrit.is* and 1.153 manuscripts have been digitized, a total of 329.000 pages. At the end of the year 883 book titles, a total of 289.000 pages, were accessible on *baekur.is* and 771 maps from the years 1544-1951 were accessible on *islandskort.is*. Work on mobile and tablet interfaces for the websites is in progress.

Web Archiving

NULI has harvested the Icelandic web domain *.is* and other Icelandic related websites since 2004. The web archive, *vefsafn.is* was opened in 2010. Copies of Icelandic websites from 1996-2004 from the Internet Archive were also added, 47 million pages and 287 gigabytes. *Vefsafn.is* currently contains about 2.550 million documents. The quantity of data is 47 terabytes, with a back-up copy. At the end of the year about 45.000 URL's belonged to the *.is* domain.

Repositories and Open Access

The Library operates *skemman.is*, an open-access repository for Icelandic universities, containing dissertations and staff research papers. It hosts nearly 16.000 works. *Rafhladan.is* is a repository for the purpose of preserving Icelandic born digital, legal deposit materials. The material is either collected by library staff or individuals, institutions or companies can deliver material over the web. It hosts around 3.500 entities.

5. New developments in managing collections.

Icelandic universities now use the SFX link solver and A-Z list to enhance access to the content of ICES and their own subscriptions. The subscription list of NULI is called *Finna timarit*. The majority of the content is also searchable in *leitir.is*

6. New developments in providing access to collections.

A discovery service under the name *leitir.is* was opened in 2011 using Primo and Primo Central Index. Users can now search Gegnir, the union catalogue, various digitized collections, e-subscriptions of the universities and resources of The Iceland Consortium for Electronic Subscriptions (ICES), *hvar.is*. The bX scholarly recommender service was also installed.

The library runs several Facebook pages, a general one for the library, and also for manuscript collections, national collections audio-visual collections, ICES, The Oral History Center and the Women's Archives.

7. Examples of collaboration between the reporting library and other national collecting institutions (libraries, archives and museums).

NULI is an active partner in the Icelandic library system, Gegnir (Aleph from ExLibris). Gegnir hosts the national union catalogue and national bibliography and gives access to information about material in most libraries in the country. The discovery service *leitir.is* and related products are also run on a collaborative basis. The NULI also runs a consortium for access to Web-Dewey.

- NULI runs The Iceland Consortium for Electronic Subscriptions (ICES), *hvar.is*. The licences are funded by institutions and majority of libraries in the country.
- NULI is partner of the European projects TEL, Europeana, Europeana Newspapers and Medioevo Europeo COST, EURIG and web archiving projects run by IIPC.
- NULI is a partner of IFLA, IIPC, CDNL, CENL and LIBER.
